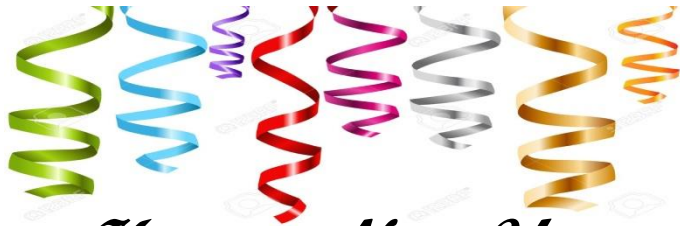

January Utility Notices

Due to Yearend procedures; the January Utility Billing will be sent out at the end of this month. The January billing is a minimum charge for the period of October 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020. Council has extended the due date till March 15, 2021

We would like to inform residents that usage on your April billing will be high due to the fact that meters were not read in 2020 due to COVID 19 restrictions and this may continue for some time. Therefore, we are asking for your assistance in March to provide the office with a meter read prior to April billing period. More details to follow in March.

Office Janitor

The Town Office is currently seeking a part-time Janitor for the interior/exterior cleaning of the building and some gardening. The ideal candidate for this position is detail-orientated, flexible and willing to take on non-routine cleaning and special projects as the need arises. The Janitor will be responsible for cleaning and sanitizing offices, council chambers, and library, pharmacy and public areas. Approximately 2 hours per week are required but must be flexible.
