TOWN OF RADISSON — BYLAW NO. 2023-12 TRAFFIC BYLAW

A bylaw regulating traffic upon the public streets of the Town of Radisson and for the preservation of order therein, and shall be known as the Traffic Bylaw.

The Council of the Town of Radisson enacts as follows:

1. In this Bylaw:

- (1) Town means the Town of Radisson.
- (2) Operator means any person who drives or operates a vehicle upon any street.
- (3) Pedestrian means any person afoot.
- (4) Police Officer means a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.
- Peace Officer means the Bylaw Enforcement Officer appointed by the Town of Radisson
- 9 end of the turning movement is travelling in a direction directly opposite to the direction that the "U Turn" means the turning of a vehicle at an intersection in such a manner that the vehicle at the vehicle was travelling immediately prior to the making of the turning movement.
- (7) Alley means a street which does not exceed 20 feet in width.
- 8 Private Driveway means a road or driveway not open to the use of the public for the purpose of vehicular travel.
- 9 Intersection means the area embraced within the prolongation of the lateral curb lines or, if none, angle, whether or not one such street or highway crosses the other. then the lateral boundary lines of two or more streets or highways which join one another at an
- (10)Crosswalks shall have the same meaning as given in the Vehicles Act of the Province of Saskatchewan.
- $(1\,1)$ Sidewalk means that portion of the street set aside for the exclusive use of pedestrians
- (12) Fire Cistern means a reservoir containing a quantity of water to be used exclusively for the purpose of combating fire.
- (13) Hydrant means a device connected with a water main, which device is used to assist in combating
- (14) Right-of-Way shall have the same meaning as in the Vehicles Act of the Province of Saskatchewan.
- (15) Vehicle shall have the same meaning as in the Vehicles Act of the Province of Saskatchewan.
- (16) Traffic Sign means all signs, signals and marking heretofore or hereafter placed or erected for the purpose of regulating or directing traffic.
- (17) Street means every way set apart for public vehicular traffic

SPEED

- (1) (a) No person shall drive a vehicle at a greater rate of speed than 40 kilometers per hour within the Town.
- (b) No person shall operate a vehicle at a speed greater than 60 kilometers per hour in The speed zones as set out in Appendix 1.
- (2) This section does not apply to Police Officers or to Emergency Vehicles when engaged in the A vehicle traveling behind other traffic shall preserve sufficient interval to enable the vehicle to performance of their duties
- When water, mush or slush is lying on any street, the driver of every motor vehicle thereon sidewalk or within the boundary of a marked or unmarked crosswalk shall so reduce the speed of his motor vehicle to avoid splashing any pedestrian using the

stop without accident in the event of a stop on the part of the leading traffic

(5)Anyone violating the provisions of this section is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00.

3 PARKING

- (<u>1</u>) Parking shall have the same definition as in the Vehicles Act of Saskatchewan and shall be regulated by the Town Authorities
- (2) i. Except as otherwise provided herein, the parking of vehicles is permitted on all highways within the municipality.

- = (a) Subject to sub clause 2(ii)(b), every person parking a vehicle upon a highway within the municipality where parking is permitted, shall parallel park the same.
- (b) Every person parking a vehicle upon a highway listed in Appendix 2 shall angle park
- **≡**: parking therein is prohibited. and maintained in accordance with the provisions of subsection 10 to indicate that any time whether such areas are marked on the curb or otherwise by signs erected No person shall park a vehicle in any "No Parking" area as designated in Appendix 3 at
- Ξ. No person shall park a vehicle within five (5) metres of any street intersection or fire
- < No person shall park any vehicle in any private place or on any private property Private property, except with the consent of such owner, occupant, licensee or unless he is the owner, occupant, licensee or permittee of the parking place or
- ≤. intended for use, in whole or in part, as a place of dwelling, a hotel or place of public (a) Subject to sub clause 2(vi)(b), no person shall park any vehicle designated for or explosive material, within 30 metres from the building in the municipality used or carrying or intended for the carrying of oil, gasoline or other flammable, combustible
- (b) Nothing in sub clause 3(f)(viii)(a) shall be deemed to restrict the parking of any
- such vehicle for such period of time as may be necessary to take on or discharge cargo. No person shall park a vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity in excess of 12,500 kg on any streets or avenues designated in Appendix 4.
- Handi-Cap Parking Zones are designated in Appendix 5.
- No operator of a vehicle shall park the said vehicle in any of the following places:
- (a) In an alley

(3)

- (b) In front of a private driveway.
- (c) Within an intersection.
- (d) On a crosswalk.
- (e) On a sidewalk
- **(f)** Within 3 metres [ten (10) feet] of block corners at intersections except at alleys
- $m{(g)}$ Within 4.5 meters [fifteen (15) feet] of the driveway entrance to any fire station
- **(h)**Within 1.5 metres [five (5) feet] of the entrance to any alley.
- (i) Within 4.5 metres [fifteen (15) feet] of the entrance to a fire cistern or hydrant
- (j) With its left-hand side to the curb, except on one-way streets.
- (k) With rear wheels to the curb.
- Any vehicle parked contrary to subsection (3) may be removed by any town official or town employee and any such removal shall be at the expense and risk of the owner of such vehicle.
- **(4)** (5) No operator of a vehicle shall park such vehicle at any place where traffic signs have been placed Privately owned and properly licensed recreation vehicles and camper trailers may be parked prohibiting parking.
- (6) No person shall park any vehicle, excepting private passenger automobiles and recreation that they are parked adjacent to the owner's property. on the street shoulder in residential areas from May 1 to September 15 of each year provided
- (7)A vehicle may be parked in the lane for the purpose of taking on or discharging cargo, provided camper trailers, with a manufacturer's rated capacity in excess of 8,000 kg or exceeding 6.10 meters (20 feet) in length on any highway, street or alley within the Town. no such vehicle shall be so parked for a period exceeding 120 minutes at one time, unless
- (8) No operator of a vehicle shall park such vehicle in any one parking place on any street continuously for any period exceeding forty-eight (48) hours. written permission has first been obtained from the Administrator.
- (9) Any vehicle parked, place or left in any street contrary to subsection (4) above or to Police signs, may be removed by any town official or town employee and such removal shall be at the expense and risk of the owner of such vehicle.
- (10) No person shall park upon a street any vehicle displayed for sale
- (11) No vehicle shall be parked on a street unless it has displayed license plates for the current year.
- (12) Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offence and for any subsequent offence to a of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00.

4 STOPPING VEHICLES

- No operator of a vehicle shall stop such vehicle in any of the following places, except where Officer, Peace Office, or a Traffic Signal: necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Police
- a) Within an intersection

- d) Within 3 metres [ten (10) feet] of block corners at intersection except at alleys
- e) Within 4.5 metres [fifteen (15) feet] of the driveway entrance to any Fire Station.
- f) Within 1.5 metres [five (5) feet] of the entrance to any alley.
- g) Within 4.5 metres [fifteen (15) feet] of the entrance to a fire cistern or hydrant.
- All "Stop" Streets are designated on Appendix 6.
- (2) (4) All "Yield" Streets are designated on Appendix 7.
- Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offence and for any subsequent offence to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00.

- (1) Every pedestrian crossing a street at any point, other than at a crosswalk, shall yield the rightof a vehicle from the duty to exercise due care for the safety of pedestrians. of-way to vehicles upon the street, provided that this provision shall not relieve the operator
- (2) Pedestrians shall move, whenever practicable, upon the right half of crosswalks.
- (3) No person shall stand on a street for the purpose of soliciting a ride from the operator of any private vehicle.
- 4 Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00. than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offence and for any subsequent offence to a

6 OBSTRUCTING TRAFFIC

- 1 No person shall park or leave standing, any vehicle whether attended or unattended on a street or sidewalk in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of other traffic or the clearing of snow from the street or sidewalk.
- (2) Whenever a Police Officer or a Peace Officer finds a vehicle on a street or sidewalk in contravention of the provisions of this section, he may move the vehicle or require the driver or operator or other person in charge of the vehicle to move it.
- (3) Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offence and for any subsequent offence to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00.

7 REFUSE ON STREETS OR SIDEWALKS

(1) Every person who throws or deposits or causes to be deposited any scraps of metal or any rubbish, refuse, waste or litter upon any street or sidewalk is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for each offence.

8 LAWFUL OBSTRUCTIONS

(1) Every person who removes, defaces or in any manner interferes with any notice or obstruction lawfully placed on a street or sidewalk is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for each offence.

9 OBSTRUCTIONS

(1) Any person who, without lawful authority places or causes to be placed upon a street or vehicular traffic is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not sidewalk, any thing which causes an obstruction to the unimpeded movement of pedestrian or more than \$250.00 for each offence.

10 TRAFFIC SIGNS

- (1) The Town Authorities may make regulations providing for the erection of signs, signals, markings, and devices within the Town.
- (2) All signs, signals, markings, and devices placed or erected on a public highway for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic shall conform to the standards and specifications set out in the manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices of Canada

(3) Every person who removes, defaces or in any manner interferes with a any sign or obstruction so lawfully placed is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for each offence.

11 AUTHORITY OF POLICE AND PEACE OFFICERS

- Police Officers and Peace Officers are authorized to direct all traffic in accordance with the or a Peace Officer provisions of this bylaw, or in emergencies as public safety or convenience may require, and no person shall neglect or refuse to comply with any order, signal, or direction of a Police Officer
- The provisions of this section also apply to the parking of vehicles on any street within the Town.
- (2) Anyone failing to comply with the provisions in this section is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for each offence.

12 BICYCLES

- (1) No person riding on a bicycle designed for carrying one person only, shall carry any other person
- (2) protective clothing necessary for the safe conveyance of the person riding the bicycle. All persons riding on a bicycle shall wear a CSA approved bicycle helmet and any other
- (3) No person over the age of twelve (12) years, shall ride a bicycle on the sidewalks of the Town.
- **4** the safety of the person riding the bicycle. No person riding a bicycle shall perform stunts or aerobatics on any street or sidewalk in the Town if it impedes or restricts the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic or undermines
- (5) Anyone failing to comply with the provisions of this section is guilty of an offence is liable to impoundment of the bicycle for a period not exceeding 30 days.

13 VEHICLE WEIGHTS

- (1) No person shall operate upon any street or alley within the Town, a vehicle having a weight of more than 10000 kg.
- (2) Every person who contravenes the provisions of Subsection (1) is liable to a fine of not less than
- (3) in excess of the gross maximum weight to allow for the delivery of goods to businesses or of The Town Authorities may, upon receiving a written request, issue a permit to a vehicle that is construction materials.
- **(**4**)** The owner, driver, operator or mover of any such vehicle, object or contrivance who has obtained the permit mentioned in this section, is nevertheless responsible for all damages that any such vehicle, object or contrivance. may be caused to the street or sidewalks by reason of driving, operating, parking, or moving of
- (5) the Town Authorities may require a bond sufficient to cover the cost of repairing such possible Such permit may be general or may limit the time and/or direct the route that may be used, and may contain special conditions or provisions to prevent injury or damage to the street, and injury to the street, alley or sidewalk.
- (6) Every person to whom a permit has been issued under Subsection (3) who operates or permits the operation of a vehicle contrary to any of the conditions of the permit is liable to a fine of not less than \$250.00 for the first offense, \$500 for the second offense and \$1000.00 for the

14 DRIVING ON SIDEWALKS

- (1) No person shall drive or park any vehicle or contrivance on or along or across any concrete, of the Town Authorities, and then only if due care and precautions have been or will be taken to protect the sidewalks from injury and that the use thereof for such purpose will not cause any unwarranted obstruction to pedestrians wood, ash or cinder sidewalks except at regular crossing places without the written permission
- (2) The owner, driver, operator or mover of any such vehicle or contrivance who has received written permission or a permit is nevertheless responsible for all damages that may be caused to the sidewalks by reason of driving, operating, parking, or moving of any such vehicle or

15 DAMAGE TO SIDEWALKS

Any person who causes damage to any sidewalk(s) in the Town shall be responsible for such damage and shall also be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00.

16 DAMAGE TO STREETS

(1) Any person who causes damage to any street(s) in the Town shall be responsible for such damage and shall also be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00.

17 LINE OF SIGHT

(1) The Town Authorities may determine that a hedge, shrub, bush or tree situated on a street contrivances, and pedestrians causing danger to traffic and may, by resolution of Council, order that such hedge, shrub, bush or tree be removed or trimmed so as to remove the danger. corner is blocking the line of sight of owners, drivers, operators, and movers of vehicles,

18 PLACING UNLAWFUL TRAFFIC SIGNS

- (1) No person shall place, maintain or display upon or in view of any street any sign, signal or device which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles a traffic sign or signal, or which attempts person doing so is guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more to direct the movement of traffic or which hides from view any traffic sign or signal, and any than \$250.00.
- (2)Any Peace Officer or Town Authority is hereby empowered to remove or cause to be removed, without notice, every such prohibited sign, signal or device.

19

- (<u>1</u>) No load exceeding in width eight (8) feet, in height thirteen and one-half (13 1/2) feet and in length sixty (60) feet, shall be moved over any street or alley unless by special permit issued in pursuance to this or any other bylaw of the Town.
- (2) Anyone found guilty of contravening this section is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00.

20 **OPENING VEHICLE DOORS**

- **(1)** No person shall:
- a) open the door of a vehicle on a street without first taking due precautions to ensure that his act will not interfere with the movement of, or endanger any other vehicle; or
- **b)** leave a door of a vehicle on a street open on the side of the vehicle available to moving traffic for a period of time longer than is necessary to load or unload passengers.
- (2) Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for each offence.

21 U TURNS AND BACKING OF VEHICLES

- No person shall make a $\mathsf U$ Turn on any street other than at an intersection
- No person riding or driving a vehicle shall make a U Turn at any of the following intersections: a) Any intersection at which a traffic sign has been erected bearing the words
- to traffic approaching an intersection from the direction in which such sign faces. "No U Turn" or works to that effect, provided that this clause shall be deemed to apply only
- b) Subject to sub clause 2(a) Appendix 8 designates "No U-Turn Intersections"
- (3) No person shall back any vehicle around a corner at any time, or back any vehicle along any street, except when reasonably necessary in entering or leaving a parking space.
- (4) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00.

22 VEHICLES DAMAGING STREET

- (1) No person shall operate or drive on any street:
- a) A vehicle having metal lugs or cleats projecting from the face of the wheels or tires thereof, or any of them, or
- as to leave a completely smooth surface to the tread thereof, or c) A vehicle having rubber tires, whether solid or pneumatic, unless such tires are in place and b) A vehicle having a caterpillar tread, unless the cleats or lugs have been removed therefrom so
- in such repair and condition as not likely to cause damage to the street

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is responsible for the repairs to the street and is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00.

23 RULES FOR OPERATION AND CONDITION OF VEHICLES

- (1) Fishtailing. No person shall operate a vehicle in such a manner as to cause the rear of the vehicle to depart from its ordinary line of progress.
- (2) Skidding and Spinning Wheels. No person shall operate a vehicle in a manner as to skid or spin the wheels or tires of the vehicle unnecessarily.
- (3) Unnecessary Noise. No person, by a vehicle or by use of any other mechanical device shall make any unnecessary noise on a street, sidewalk, alley or in any public place.
- **(4)** Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00.

24 SNOWMOBILES AND ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

- (1) Notwithstanding legislation from other Acts and Regulations, it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile or an all terrain vehicle between the hours of 8:00 am and 9:00 pm.
- (2) Snowmobiles may only be operated on the streets or alleys of the Town in order to exit the Town boundaries and may be crossed at intersections only.
- (3) (i) All Terrain Vehicles may be operated on Town streets and alleys as if it is any other type of motor vehicle
- (ii) Subject to sub clause 24(3)(i), Appendix 9 outlines areas where All Terrain Vehicles are prohibited.
- (4) For recreational uses such as rallies, racing, or similar activities, All Terrain Vehicles may only be operated on the streets or alleys of the Town in order to exit the Town boundaries.
- (5) Notwithstanding legislation from other Acts and Regulations, it shall be lawful to operate a purpose of crossing said highway. snowmobile or an all terrain vehicle on the portions of Provincial Highway No. 16 only for the
- 6) Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section is liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00 for each offence and for any subsequent offence to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$250.00.

25 SCHOOL BUS FLASHING LIGHTS

- (1) Subject to clause 25(2), the operator of a school bus when operating a school bus on public Highways in the municipality shall not activate the safety lights.
- (2) Provisions of clause 25(1) shall not apply at the locations listed in Appendix 10

26 PENALTIES

- (<u>1</u>) Where any person commits, or is alleged to have committed, an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw, the following procedures may be followed in respect thereto by the Peace Officer or by the Town Authorities to wit:
- a) A "Notice of Violation" may be given to a person who commits or is alleged to have committed an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw and this person may appear at the Town of Radisson office within five (5) business days from the date of the notice and pay a voluntary payment for the specific infraction described in such notice. Compliance with such notice prosecution in respect to such infraction. within the period of time prescribed therein, shall relieve such person from liability to
- b) Non-compliance with any such notice shall not in any way affect or prejudice the right of the respect to the infraction described in such notice. person named therein to defend any charge which may subsequently be laid against him in
- c) A Notice of Violation shall be as outlined in Appendix 11.

APPENDIX 9 of Bylaw No. 2023-12 LOCATIONS ATV'S ARE PROHIBITED [section 24(3)(ii)]

The purpose of *The All Terrain Vehicles Act* (ATV Act) is to ensure the safe and proper operation of all terrain vehicles (ATVs), both the three and four-wheeled types. The following key points are taken from the ATV Act - for a complete copy, please contact the Queen's Printer, 1871 Smith Street, Regina, Sask. S4P 3V7 (306)787-6894.

occupant of private or Crown land. Section 6 requires that any operation of ATVs on private land must be with the consent of the owner or

Section 7 states that no person shall operate an ATV on the "traveled" portion of the highway - except where a municipality has passed a bylaw describing the specific roads within their boundaries where ATVS may be operated (see section 9).

Section 9 of the ATV Act provides municipalities with authority to permit the operation of ATVs on the "traveled" portion of specific roads within its boundaries by passing a bylaw.

Section 10 states that any order made by the Highway Traffic Board to prohibit the operation of ATVs is not applicable on any river, lake or other body of water in the winter.

Section 11 provides authority for a municipality to pass a bylaw to prohibit the operation of ATVs on the "untravelled" portion of any roads within its boundaries; and also on private land, or municipal land (including hamlet or organized hamlet) or Crown land, all within its boundaries.

Section 13 states that a bylaw to prohibit the operation of ATVs as per Section 11 is enforceable only if

the areas listed in the bylaw are properly marked and signed.

Section 32 provides for a fine of not more than \$1000.00 or imprisonment term of not more than 30 days for violation of any municipal bylaw or the ATV Act.
