PLEASE NOTE: *Junior Directors are encouraged to help in the areas that are of the most interest to them during the three days of the Fair. This is the reason that they are not listed as directors in a particular area.*

Rules and Regulations

- Memberships are \$7.00. ALL DIRECTORS MUST HAVE CURRENT MEMBERSHIP.
- A membership is not needed to exhibit.
- The Society or Officials will not be responsible for loss or damage to persons or property while on the Fair Grounds.
- **EXHIBITS WHICH HAVE BEEN ERRONEOUSLY ENTERED WILL NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER CLASS AND WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**
- All classes except Horses will be judged on Friday. NO EXHIBITS WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE GROUNDS UNTIL 4:00 PM SUNDAY. Horses will be judged on Saturday.
- Exhibitors must parade their animals when and where they are required.
- Age of all animals will be computed from Jan 1, of the current year.
- All animals will be well halter broken except for animals less than six months. No premium will be awarded to competitors not complying with this rule.
- When a protest is to be made against the competitions of an animal or article in any class, notice of same should be filed with the Secretary before the class is passed upon, that the Judge may be instructed to place a reserve award and that the premium may be properly distributed in the event of a protest being sustained.
- In Sections 1 all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor 15 days before the fair, except harness.
- At the time of judging of section 3 to 19 only the directors will be present with the Judge. **DIRECTORS SHALL IN NO WAY INFLUENCE THE DECISION OF THE JUDGE.**
- Judges of sections 3 to 19 will report to the secretary upon their arrival on the grounds.
- In the absence of competitions in any section or if the articles or stocks exhibited are of inferior quality the Judges shall award only such premiums as they think the article or stock merits. They shall exercise their discretion as to whether they will award 1st, 2nd or any premium EXCEPT IN JUNIOR AND SCHOOL WORK SECTIONS WHERE A 1st, 2nd AND 3rd SHALL BE AWARDED.
- Any person who attempts to interfere or influence the judges while in the discharge of their duties, or while at any time on the premises of the Association use any contemptuous or abusive language to any judge, or within his or her hearing, in consequences of any award made by a judge, shall forfeit his right to any premium to which he might otherwise be requested to report any breach of this rule.
- Any exhibitor making a protest must do so in writing addressed to the secretary & deliver within 48 hours to the holding of the class concerned. The cause of the protest must be stated and a deposit of \$10.00 must accompany the protest. The deposit will forfeit to the Society if the protest is not sustained. If the committee in charge is unable to reach a decision, the protest will be decided by the Board of Directors of the Society.
- In the case where a protest is entered for a malicious purpose the Board of Directors may exclude the party from exhibiting for one or more years.
- No entry fee is required for Junior or School work. In all other classes the fee is \$1.00 or as stated.
- Please cash prize cheques in a timely manner.
- The Directors of the Society will not be responsible for any articles left in the Exhibit Building.
- **All judges' decisions are final.**
- **In Sections 3 to 19 inclusive, only one entry may be made by any one exhibitor in each class**
- **IN CLASSES 3 - 19, ENTRIES OF ANY EXHIBITS THAT WERE PREVIOUSLY ENTERED, CANNOT BE ENTERED AGAIN.**

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Waiver and Release must be signed.
- Entries taken 9:30-11:00am, Saturday. No entries after 12:00pm.
- Points awarded for each horse's performance in each age group. All classes in each age group to count.
- Exhibitors must enter each horse under a different number. Display number on exhibitor.
- Horses may be entered once in each class. (One rider per horse per age group)
- Failure to follow any course or pattern will result in disqualification.
- All classes open to stallions. (With provisions that they be handled by persons 18 years or older).
- Cowboy or heeled boots **must** be worn, and western attire **should** be worn by all competitors.
- All youth under 18 years are required to wear an approved ASTM/SE1 helmet in every event.
- All participants compete at their own risk.
- Participants must have a wrist band, purchased at the gate and worn on the wrist, to enter any classes.
- When participant's number has been called, they must go into the designated area.
- Judge's decisions are final.

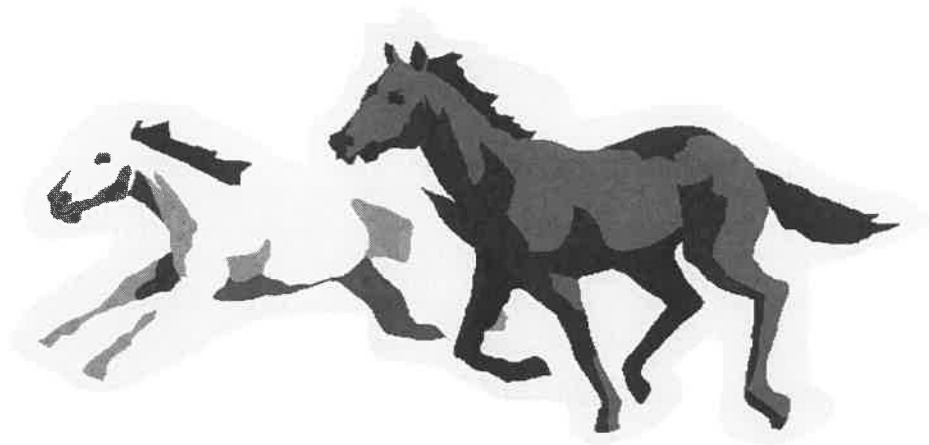
